Dear Aquinas Parents,

Here we are in the final week of Lent. The holiest and most sacred days of the entire year are upon us. This is the week wherein we walk most closely with Our Blessed Lord; His journey to Jerusalem, to His suffering, His crucifixion, and His death on the Cross. Just two days ago, during the Palm Sunday liturgy, the words of the fickle crowd were forced upon our own lips: "Crucify Him!" Every year, when this reading comes along, I find it so difficult to pronounce these words. Then I reflect upon them and the truth they hold. How often do I, by my words, actions, or omissions, crucify my Lord? Sure, I'd like to think that I would be among the faithful few who remained with the Lord at the foot of the Cross mourning the injustice, but when I examine my life, my sins more likely number me among the crowd outside of the Praetorium calling for His death.

This week, we are invited to walk with the Lord in His journey to Calvary. It is an opportunity to reflect on our own sinfulness that has caused the Lord so much suffering. It is an opportunity to express our gratitude to the Lord for His merciful love for us, a love so deep that it embraced the cross. It is an opportunity to choose anew to take up our own crosses each day, freely and joyfully, knowing that He led the way and that He carries us when we can go no further.

This week, I will be praying in a particular way that each of you receives the grace "to follow Jesus faithfully, not in words but in deeds" (Pope Francis, Palm Sunday message), that you may rejoice most fully in the glory of the Easter Resurrection.
